Objectives

- Analysis of factors that predispose youth, male and female to engage in radicalization and VE in Kenya and Uganda.
- To analyze existing/emerging policies and practices related to PICVE that create safe spaces for youth voices to be heard.
- To identify interventions by state and non-state actors to engage and empower youth in PICVE in Kenya and Uganda.
- To identify and document what has worked/what has not worked and why in the PICVE programs in the IGAD region.


- Youth participation & engagement in P/CVE process at all levels.
